Notify the Nova Scotia College of Pharmacists (NSCP) of intent to register*, complete application, process and submit required documents and statements and Letter of Standing on capacity to Practice Pharmacy**

Take English fluency test/s¹

Take Jurisprudence Examination

I: Submit documents for Evaluation to the Pharmacy Examining Board of Canada (PEBC)²
II: Write PEBC Evaluating Examination³
III: Take PEBC Qualification Examination (OSCE)⁴
IV: Receive PEBC Certification

Add PEBC Certification to NSCP Application

Complete internship application. Complete 20 week structured practice experience / internship program and 1 week practice assessment

Obtain liability insurance and receive license to practice pharmacy in Nova Scotia
